"Only one of our clients so far has coloured the outside of their garden building," says Fotheringham. "Our clients seem to like the larch cladding on the outside, because it just fades into the background."

Her customers do tend to get carried away with the spec, however. "We normally have to gently reduce the size that people think they want – we would like them to end up with a building they'll use, not one they'll rattle around in.

"All of our buildings are bespoke by the time clients add extra features; we rarely build to the basic price list. Our most expensive garden building was the one for a client who wanted it to house his full-size snooker table – that came in at around £85,000, and the design also incorporated a garage and a shed. Usually, though, they are in the region of £40,000 with a shower room, and £30,000 without."

Where you're talking more than a refurbished tool shed or a timber hut, Fotheringham is confident that most home-owners will at least get back the money they spend on a garden building – especially in the South East of England, where domestic space is at a premium. Add insulation and a bathroom, and you'll enjoy the kind of added value associated with creating an extra Rooms (well, almost) with a view: Designer Andy Sturgeon created this blackframed pavilion in oak, left, inspired by modern Japanese architecture, for the Cancer Research UK Garden at last year's Chelsea Flower Show. bedroom or an extension. Other practicalities to consider are getting the location right, choosing the aspect and deciding whether to insulate or not. You need to site your garden building at least five metres away from your house; any closer and it will be classed as an extension, and you will need to seek planning permission.

Lynn Fotheringham recommends a west-facing site where possible, but suggests brightening north- or east-facing buildings with Velux roof-lights. Andy Sturgeon always avoids a south-facing aspect and advises small windows at the back or sides to allow good air circulation. He also suggests shading any glass with trees and plants; much more pleasing than a set of faded curtains.

Insulation will allow you to enjoy the room all year round – a huge bonus for any garden-lover – and there are other ways of 'greening' it, too: "Solar panels will only work when installed at the correct angle, though," advises Andy Sturgeon. And that can be tricky on more modern designs with flat roofs. "You can always add a water butt to recycle rainwater," he continues. "A green roof [one that has been grassed] can also help if you need to apply for planning permission – particularly in urban areas – because it will greatly *improve* the view for you and your neighbours."
